Luke's Story!

Just minutes after engaging in a conversation with Luke, I came to the conclusion that I was talking to a very intelligent young boy. He is an absolute joy to talk to. He carries on a mature conversation with whomever he is speaking with. Luke has lived all his life in Sierra Vista, AZ with his parents and his 16-year old sister. He enjoys playing basketball, playing with nerf guns, and wrestling with his sister. When asked what was one thing he wanted to accomplish in life, he said that it was to learn how to ride a bike.

When Luke was four years old, he failed a hearing test and was referred to Children's Clinics for genetic testing. After extensive testing and research by both the clinic physicians and his parents, they found that he had an extremely rare condition called Van Maldergem Syndrome Type 2. It is so rare that at the time he was diagnosed, he was only the 11th person in the world to have been diagnosed with it.

At Children's Clinics, Luke is treated in the Neurology, Audiology, Genetics, Cardiology, and ENT clinics. He wears a Baha Bone Anchor Hearing Aide which helps with his hearing. An internal hearing aid might be a possibility in the future, but for now he is comfortable with an external one which he can control himself. Due to his condition, Luke has an unpredictable sleep schedule. There are times when he is awake all night, and needs to get his sleep whenever he can get it.

The following was written by Luke's mother in hopes of educating others about her and her family's experience.





Luke's Story from his Mother, Jennifer:

Luke is an 11 year old boy with quite a different story than most children. In fact, there are only approximately 25 kids in the world (as of yet) that know what Luke experiences first hand. Luke was born with what is considered an ULTRA rare syndrome. On January 26, 2017, we finally received the diagnosis. Our little boy was born with Van Maldergem Syndrome Type 2. After years worth of specialists and speculations the one thing we hadn't prepared for was something so rare. As a parent you try to brace yourself for the worst, yet hope for the best. I wasn't sure where this outcome fell into that. Luke's diagnosis came with more questions than answers.

Quickly, we began to immerse ourselves in the facts; the tangibles, if you will. We know that Van Maldergem Syndrome is an autosomal recessive disorder, meaning two copies of an abnormal gene (one from each genetic donor) must be present in order for the disease to develop.

Van Maldergem Syndrome is characterized by intellectual disability, craniofacial features, auditory malformations resulting in hearing loss, and the list goes on. Today, with a few years of this diagnoses under our belt, we have the knowledge that every case is truly unique. Of course our greatest hope, long term for Luke, is to find a way to receive more research and gain more knowledge about the rare disease that is now a big apart of our story. For now, our comfort comes from our family and the team of Doctors and staff at Children's Clinics.

Luke has been a patient at the Children's Clinics now for 6 years. Our journey began without the forethought of just how important it would be for our son to visit all his specialists in one location. Convenience aside, I have seen Luke go from scared and unsure, to excited and confident when it's time to "go to the doctor". When you have multiple doctors with continuous visits, it brings so much comfort to walk through the same doors and see the same faces. Children's Clinics took the fear and made it fun, for not only Luke, but our whole family.

Today, Luke is feeling more effects from this disease than years before, but his smile still lights up the room and he radiates joy. Luke loves spending time with his big sister Emelia and her friends that so graciously make him feel included. Luke loves superheroes, his favorite being Spiderman.

Luke is an animal lover, but his dog Olive has his heart, and she loves him just as much. Luke is a typical little boy for the most part, as we move forward we see more evidence of this syndrome than we have in previous years. We are venturing down a path yet to be forged and although the fear could overwhelm us, we choose to see the light in it all. We hope to touch people with Luke's story while educating those who may receive this diagnosis in the future. What's New at the Clinic?

Last year, Children's Clinics, our partner that provides care to the patients here at the clinic, was awarded a \$700,000 Angel Charity Grant. The grant was for renovations that would enable them to expand the Rehab Department and develop a future Autism Center for Excellence.

July 2019 marked the beginning of the renovations. This four-phase remodel included the addition of a private, serene Behavioral Health Suite, sensory-friendly spaces to house a future Autism Center of Excellence, and an upgrade/expansion of the existing Rehabilitative Therapy Department. As of February 2020, nine Behavioral Health rooms have been added along with two Sensory Rooms, three Consult Rooms, one Feeding Room, six Rehab Therapy Gyms, an Outdoor Therapy Space, a Private Family Room, an Interactive Floor in the Lobby, two Toy Wash Rooms, three expansive storage areas, and enough documentation space for 30 therapists.



This project is on target to be completed in April 2020 and will allow the clinic to provide improved care to the 6,000 children who are treated at the clinic. This coming Fall, Square & Compass will be joining Children's Clinics, in celebration of the Grand Opening of the Angel Charity Center for C.A.R.E and their 30th Anniversary. We are proud to have Children's Clinics as our partner in providing care to children with complex medical conditions and look forward to working together for many years to come.
